## Program

Our guest today was **Mike Cragg, HWS Head Football Coach**. Mike has been with HWS for 33 years and lives right here in Geneva. I will apologize now and say I know absolutely nothing about football, or sports in general. Most of what Mike said was way over my head and try as I might; I will not do him much justice on my note taking abilities.

HWS employs 4 full time coaches, and between the four, they visit 45 campuses to recruit players/students for HWS. With new rules in effect, double practices are no

longer allowed, so they spend time analyzing film to see what they are doing right and wrong.

Currently, Hobart is 14<sup>th</sup> in the nation and they have a great team. This year they are bringing in 49 freshmen who can either be in JV or Varsity teams. Only the Varsity team travels for away games. One third of last year's freshmen lettered in varsity. The team does a great deal of community outreach such as ringing the bell for the Salvation Army, and working at Happiness House.
