Fines/Happy Dollars



Program

Today we were joined by **Dan Grillone** from **Cobblestone Coffee Roasters**. He gave us a great presentation on the coffee bean (seed). A coffee plant produces a red fruit that is harvested. Inside that fruit, is a small green seed which eventually produces our coffee. I found this great infographic online that explains the entire process. (You may have to zoom in to read the graphic)



Brazil is the number one producer and the U.S. is the number one consumer of coffee. There are two major types of beans, Arabica and Robusta. Robusta is the lower quality bean, and is often used to blend coffees to save big distributors money. All the different types of roasts depend on the temperature at which the bean is roasted.
