Program

Ontario County Sheriff Phil Povero began his career with the Sheriff's office in 1972 as a corrections and communications officer. In January, 1973, he was assigned to the Sheriff's Road Patrol. From 1977 to 1990, he served as an investigator in the Criminal Investigation Division. He was elected to the Office of Sheriff in 1990. During his tenure, the Sheriff has implemented the D.A.R.E. Program and provided School Resource Officers to Ontario County school districts.

The Sheriff talked to us today about the changes in the correctional facility since he had been Sheriff as well as the increasing substance abuse problem. He said that 75-80% of inmates have addiction problems and that he fears it will get worse before it gets better.
