Today we hosted representatives from the Seneca Sailing Academy. The academy created a nonprofit association to bring the sailing academy to the surrounding communities. This year they secured a grant allowing them to give a slot to 18 lucky sailors. The academy needs our help getting the word out, so more young people apply for the sailing scholarships.

Any young person between the ages of 7 and 17 is eligible to enter to win the scholarship. So many lessons are packed into learning sailing. Students will learn math, science, system thinking, problem solving, patience and adventure.
