Program

Our speaker today was **Heather Tuttle, General Manager of the I Love NY Finger Lakes Welcome Center on Seneca Lake in Geneva.**

Heather gave us a bit of what led up to the creation of our new Welcome Center. By year's end, thanks to the Governor Andrew Cuomo initiative, there will be a visitors center in each and every region of our state. However, ours is the ONLY one on a lake. This center is a showcase for our growing food and beverage industries (Taste New York) as well as for tourism. It is unique in that the city of Geneva owns the actual building yet the state of New York oversees everything else. NY Ag and Markets leases the building from the city of Geneva. Empire State Development oversaw the design and construction which took place between September, 2017 and May, 2018. The Governor spoke at the ribbon cutting ceremony at the end of May and is the only grand opening attended by the Governor. The month of July brought an estimated 45,000 visitors to the Geneva Center. If you haven't yet visited our new Welcome Center, stop by for a walkaround tour, have lunch at the café, sip a glass of a FLX beverage on the outdoor patio, lakeside, or visit the Farmers' Market on Saturday morning.
