## **Program**

**Vickie Freyleve, American Cancer Society** was our speaker today. The topic of her presentation was **HPV – Cancer Free**, a very informative discussion of the Human Papilloma Virus vaccine.

Some highlights included:

- Mission is to eradicate HPV
- Vaccine is available now
- 90% of HPV can be prevented through vaccine
- Vaccination rate for U.S. and World is too low
- Rotary had tremendous success in eradicating polio through Polio Plus, now need to concentrate on HPV.
- Goal is to eradicate cervical cancer, 85% of which occurred in less developed regions.
- American Cancer Society and Rotary can work together to globally increase vaccination rates.
- Still a long way to go
