Program

Today’s speaker is **Lisa Davis, Women’s Health Services Co-Ordinator at Geneva General Hospital**. With October being Breast Cancer Awareness Month, Lisa informed us of the progress made at GGH and at Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hospital in establishing 3-D Mammography services. She outlined changes in screening since 2000: from film to digital to 3-D which is now considered to be the standard. 3-D equipment makes a 15 image “sweep” of the breast, creating a three-dimensional picture. It is used to look for breast cancer in people who have no symptoms as well as to investigate the cause of breast problems. The Geneva 3-D ribbon cutting was held on November 30, 2018. The Soldiers and Sailors ribbon cutting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 30, 2019, 3-5 pm.

Finger Lakes Health offers Walk-In Screening Mammograms on the second Monday of the month, October 14, November 11, and December 9 at 7:30-11:30 a.m. and 12:45-4:30 p.m. at 200 North Street, Geneva Women’s Health Services 315 787-4400. Penn Yan Walk-In Screening is the third Wednesday of the month: October 16, November 20, and December 18, 9:30 a.m.- 6:00 pm at 418 North Main Street, Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hospital, 418 North Main Street, Penn Yan. Lisa emphasized that “screening” does not mean “treatment” and that men do also get breast cancer, although they are thought to be symptomatic, and should be screened as well.
