Program

Today's Speaker: Chris Lavin and Allauna Overstreet- Gibson for Boys and Girls Club of Geneva

Chris Lavin provided an update on the numbers for the past 5 years

- Kids attending From 140 originally, to 240 kids now
- Employees went from 13- 25
- Thanks to the help of Trina Newton and Mark Gearan his budget increased significantly
- Tutors went from 0-40 a week (each spending an hour doing homework with kids)
- Thanks to a partnership with St Peter's Arts Academy, 11 kids are taking piano lessons

Allauna Overstreet-Gibson graduated from Geneva High School and HWS. She went on to work in Seattle with kids and at a YMCA and is happy to be back helping our kids. Alluana is the site supervisor for the Teen Center.

They have a number of programs:

- Smart Girls (personal empowerment),
- Keyboarding
- Torch Clubs
- Money Matters Program to teach kids financial responsibility
- Diplomas to Degree program- (planning next steps after high school)

Keyboarding is popular - 21 kids have taken group lessons

Programs run daily from 3-6 pm. Served a snack when they arrive and then dinner around 5pm.

They are not open on the weekend, but there is a hoop it up program for basketball on Friday night, they send kids home with food to get them through the weekend.
