## <u>Program</u>

Jim Dickson introduced **District Governor Linda Kohl**. Linda is a lifelong resident of Penfield and a long time elected council member for the Town of Penfield. She has served as Deputy Town Supervisor and has served on, and led numerous committees, notably chairing the Town Bicentennial Committee in 2010. She was a member of the original Open Space Committee in 2001 and was selected to chair the Town Open Space Update Committee in 2005.

She currently is the chair for the Community Services Committee and is town liaison to the Penfield Library Board, Local History Room Advisory Board, Friends of the Dayton Corners Schoolhouse, Penfield Symphony Orchestra and the co-liaison to Penfield & Webster School District.

Linda was selected as the Rotary District 7120 Governor for 2020-2021 and is currently in the role of Rotary District Governor Nominee Designate. Linda joined the Penfield Rotary Club in 2005 and as an active Rotarian, has served as President twice in 2008-2009 and again in 2015-2016. She served on the Penfield Rotary Board of Directors for 12 years and is Club Director of Public Relations. Linda is Assistant Governor for Area 10 (East Rochester, Fairport, Irondequoit, Penfield, Pen Web and Webster clubs) for 2017-2018. She is a member of the District Public Image Committee and Chaired the District Website competition in 2015. She is also a Paul Harris Fellow.

She shared Rotary International President Holger Knaak's theme for 2020-21 – Rotary opens opportunities. Despite the challenging times we are living in, there are still opportunities. Everything we do as Rotarians opens an opportunity for someone somewhere. To support the theme, there are four goals for Clubs. First, expand outreach by creating a satellite Club or a community based Club. Second, have at least one strategic meeting a year. Third, select new members carefully. Finally, continue efforts to end polio by donating to END POLIO NOW.

Her goal for the district is membership. Not just new members but engaging current members. If members feel engaged, they will stay with the club. This is especially difficult due to COVID-19.

Two new committees have been started. The first is the Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee. The committee will develop best practices to make our District more welcoming and inclusive. This committee is also another way to grow Clubs. The other committee is the Environmental Action Committee. Rotary International has added the Environment as the 7<sup>th</sup> area of focus and beginning in July 2021 grants will be available through the Rotary Foundation for environment projects. The first meeting for this committee is on September 21 and anyone interested in joining can contact Linda.

When it comes to fundraising, it's time to think outside the box and some Clubs are doing just that (road rallies and online auctions). The District did receive a grant from Rotary International's COVID Relief Fund to provide ARC's in the district with PPE and hand sanitizer.

We also have to embrace technology and hybrid meetings (onsite and Zoom) are encouraged. Again this is all about keeping members engaged. The majority of Clubs she has visited are meeting solely through Zoom. All training this year will also be on Zoom.

The District Conference will be held on May 8 in Corning. It will be a hybrid meeting but plans are in place to have an all virtual meeting if needed.
