- Check to make sure you are registered to vote (Susie Flick added that registration forms are available at the Library)
- Absentee voting: you may apply for an Absentee Ballot by mail, phone, email, or online.
- Reviewed how to fill out the ballot
- Your ballot can be sent in the mail, or dropped off at any of the early voting locations: Board of Elections Office in Canandaigua or Geneva Housing Authority on Lewis St.
- If a mistake is made on the ballot, you will be able to correct it.
- New York State will hold absentee ballots for one week before counting.
