Program

Stephanie introduced **Nancy McDermott** who has been writing and speaking about parenting for over ten years. She discussed her book *The Problem With Parenting: How Raising Children Is Changing Across America*. According to her, parenting has become needlessly complex. Her book takes a deep dive into why this has happened and why it's difficult to change the parenting culture. A couple of points from her book -

- A shift in how people see themselves has effected how they raise children
- The concept of "parenting" didn't exist until the 1970s. At the same time culture changes were transforming the concept of family.
- Parents began turning to expertise (classes, experts, tv shows, books, etc.) and this expertise began to take the place of past norms and experiences. New childrearing norms became based on science and therapeutics.
- The parent-child relationship has been prioritized over all other relationships
- Extension of parental power (extends to before they have children and into a child's adulthood)
- Parenting has become child focused not child centered
