Program

Jason Haag introduced our speaker, Chris D'Amico with Geneva Youth Lacrosse. Over 500 kids play lacrosse and soccer in Geneva. The Geneva Youth Lacrosse and Soccer programs, with the Town of Geneva, are creating an outdoor box sports facility behind the Geneva Town Hall. Total cost of the project is \$100,000. The Town has given

\$50,000 and Geneva Youth Sports has to raise the rest. The facility will be 80 ft. x 160 ft. with turf. The school district allows K-6th teams to use the school district's space when its available. The outdoor box will provide a central place to practice and play. Though priority will be given to Geneva Youth Sports, the whole community will be able to use the outdoor box. Future plans for the space also includes bathrooms and a concessions stand. So far \$35,000-\$40,000 has been raised.
