Jerry introduced our speaker, **Seneca County Historian Walt Gable**, who presented "9/11 and September 11 Patriot Day and National Day of Service & Remembrance." Along with an overview of the attacks on the World Trade Center and the Pentagon, and Flight 93, he shared what has been done to commemorate these events.

- World Trade Center site
 - The National September 11 Memorial and Museum opened at the former location of the Twin Towers on September 11, 2011
 - "Freedom Center" (common name for the new One World Trade Center building) is 1776 feet tall and opened in November 2014
- Flight 93
 - The Flight 93 National Memorial near Shanksville, Pennsylvania was established in September 2002. The site includes a museum, wall of honor and the "Tower of Voices."
- On September 4, 2002 President George W. Bush proclaimed September 11 as Patriot Day
- In 2009 President Obama designated September 11 Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance.

All of us can reflect on what we can do to ensure that these events are not forgotten and that they won't happen again.
