- Funded by New York State, the Entrepreneurial Assistance Program assists anyone (especially veterans, minorities, and women) who want to start a new business or need help with their current business. The program has business centers located around the state.
- The business center in Geneva opened in June 2021 and is part of the Ibero-American Action League. The center serves 11 counties.
- The center's services include
 - A ten-week business training course. By the end of the course participants will have a business plan. 13 people are currently enrolled in the course.
 - o One-on-one assistance or mentorships for course graduates
 - Assistance with preparing and submitting the Minority and Women-Owned Enterprise Certification Application
 - Assistance with grant applications
