


WEDNESDAY WRAP-UP

Jerry Forcier shared the story of Polio Paul, the last American in an iron lung due to Polio. Paul, who's real name is Paul Alexander, contracted Polio at age 6 and has been confined to an iron lung since that time. Despite his disability, Paul was able to graduate from the University of Texas and pursued his dream of becoming an attorney (Jerry was not sure why anyone would want that!). Paul also published his biography which he wrote by painstakingly typing one letter at a time. Paul remains upbeat and states that his days are much like everyone else's – he just needs a bit more help.

Jason Haag spoke about Geneva's Cub Scout Pack 5 which is for children from kindergarten to 5th grade (not just boys). The pack currently has a membership of 35 youth and meets outdoors when the weather permits, otherwise they meet at Hydrant Hose. Adult volunteers are down by 2 (anyone interested?).
