

<u>Program</u>

Dr. Kathleen Davis, Kevin Donahue, and Michael Ferrari shared the Geneva City School District's proposed capital improvement projects.

- There are two funding sources New York State Building Fund and the school district's capital reserve.
- There will be zero tax impact on the community
- The project is within the state designed debt limit and a simple majority vote (59%) is needed to approve it
- All buildings will have the public address and fire systems upgraded
- North Street
 - o Cost \$745,524
 - Repairs to the Carter Road entrance
 - Repairs to the exterior doors to the courtyard garden (reduce condensation levels)
- West Street
 - o Cost \$3,958,985
 - New roof
 - Replace exhaust fans and skylight in the kitchen
 - Re-design the bus loop
 - o Improve traffic flow patterns in the parking lots
- Middle/High Schools
 - Cost \$13,662,669
 - Pavement repair around the front entrance
 - Replace roof over the pool, pool lighting and pool liner
 - Renovate Middle School Library into a multipurpose space (library, classroom, meeting and event space)
 - Upgrades to the technology rooms at the Middle School (two classrooms/shops being combined into one)
 - o Installation of an entry canopy at the Middle School
- Central Service Building
 - o Cost \$3,001,682
 - Improve drainage in the fields
 - Restoration/replacement of pavement
 - Renovation of the bus wash
- Project total with contingencies \$27,500,000

- Timeline
 - November 30 at 7pm a public meeting is being held in the high school library.
 - Referendum vote on December 7 from 12 to 9 pm in the North Street mini gym
 - o January September 2022 design
 - September 2022 February 2023 State ED review and approval
 - February March 2023 bid and award
 - April 2023-August 2024 construction
