Program – Stove Team International

A video was presented featuring Rotarian Nancy Hughes, Founder of Stove Team International.

The District 7120 Environmental Action Committee is raising money to support this worthwhile international project. It comes from a group called StoveTeam International, and its goal is to provide nearly smokeless cookstoves that would replace open pit fires being burned inside homes. The cookstoves will reduce smoke and black carbon particles in the air, as well as reducing the risk of burns received as a result of tripping and falling into the fire. Lung disease from the smoke of open cooking fires kills about 4 million people every year, most of them women and children, and open fire cooking is a major contributor of climate change and deforestation. The District Committee is working toward applying for a Rotary International global grant. To date \$11,825.00 has been raised from 14 Clubs in the District, with donations ranging from \$100 to \$1,600, but they also welcome contributions from individuals. The Geneva Rotary Board fully supports this project.
