There are three primary areas of focus – beautification, economic development, and events. There are 1 ½ full time staff and 1 ½ part-time staff. Mills has focused on creating regional partnerships. Upcoming BID events are Cruisin' Night (July 15) and the Garlic Festival (concert downtown on August 5 and on the lakefront on August 6 and 7).
