- A lot of activities include arts and crafts and photography.

Dave explained some of the duties of the Board which meets once a month in Clifton Springs. They vote every year on what the budget should be for running the camp which includes:

- Two nurses
- Counselors
- Maintaining the Swimming Pool
- Maintaining the Bath House
- Proceeds from the Santa Train go to the camp

Dave encouraged everyone to help out with the camp if you can. He also noted that your purchases on Amazon can benefit the camp.
