#### **Program**

Jerry Forcier introduced our speaker Kaitlin Fello from Seneca Lake Pure Waters Association. Founded in 1990, Seneca Lake Pure Waters' mission is to preserve, protect, and promote the water quality of Seneca Lake. Their three main areas of focus are volunteerism/citizen science, education and partnerships.

Water Quality Programs

- DEC Citizens Statewide Lake Assessment Program Statewide project to learn the trends of the lake
- Harmful Algal Blooms Shoreline Monitoring The shoreline is monitored for ten weeks (mid-July to October). The public can sign up and receive "Bloom Watch" via email on the website

- Partnership for Regional Invasive Species Management with the Finger Lakes Institute
- Monitoring Streams–Monitors nutrients and sediment flowing into the lake from 6 streams.

#### Research

- Fish study with the Finger Lakes Institute to understand why there is a decline in fish species. The study will begin at the Lake Trout Derby
- New Watershed Management Plan –figuring out where pollutants are entering the lake and where efforts should be focused to prevent this. The plan will help applying for funding.

Volunteers – With two paid employees, there are plenty of volunteer opportunities. In 2021 people volunteered nearly 3,000 hours.

Awareness – A monthly e-newsletter is published.
