<u>Program</u>

Our speakers today were Mary Bakogiannis and Sara Allen of the Geneva YMCA.

They talked about the Y's community impact and the Capital Improvement Project. Some highlights include:

- The Geneva YMCA was incorporated in 1870 with the original building on Castle Street. The current facility was built in 1971 on William Street.
- A newly designed facility is being planned to meet the needs of the changing community. Including:
 - o Expanded and improved facilities
 - o Expanded childcare center
 - New group exercise space
- Today the Y serves more than 3000 children, families, adults and senior citizens through their health and wellness programs, childcare, youth sports and aquatics facilities. (closed for 6 months during COVID which hurt their membership by 50% but it is coming back.)
- Free swim lessons to every 1st grader in the Geneva City School District
- Free access for City residents ages 65 and older
- Coupon book available to Town of Geneva residents
- Silver Sneakers program available through participating health insurance
- Campaign Goal is \$4.5 million
