- DARE is taught around the country
- Instructors receive two weeks of training
- Over the years the program has expanded beyond drug and substance abuse.
 Lessons now include better decision making, bullying, and how to cope with stress
- 5th graders at North Street and St. Stephens go through a 10-week program with a different lesson each week
- Along with students writing essays or creating posters, the program ends with awards and a graduation ceremony
- The program works and both believe the program also
 - o Gets kids not to be afraid to approach a police officer
 - o Connects the community and the police department
 - Shows that police officers are members of the community who are giving back






