PROGRAM:

Presented by Geneva Rotarian and City of Geneva Fire Chief Del Parrotta, we welcomed an excellent overview of emergency response protocol.

First and foremost, BE CALM. Know how to unlock your cell phone for emergencies. Call 911. Use your speaker phone. Turn of your emotions. Remember that CALM generates CALM. Start CPR if warranted until help arrives.

Chief Parrotta then demonstrated hands-only CPR on adults and children and AED: Automated External Defibrillators. He also demonstrated the Heimlich maneuver.

Finally, Chief also reminded us about the unmistakable signs of drug overdoses, the availability and use of NARCAN as well as the alarming need for its recurring use. Our thanks to Chief Parrotta for an excellent (and a bit entertaining) presentation.
