- Just finished their annual fundraiser, a multicultural food festival. It was very successful and Rotary International President Jennifer Jones attended.
- Their main project is sponsoring scholarships to Sylhet Agricultural University. Many students go on to master's programs.
- They host at least one youth exchange a year.
- A new program will be a summer camp where 12 international students (ages 17-20) will go on a 9-day tour of Norway. They are working with other Clubs on the camp.
- Next year they are hosting the Rotary Youth Leadership Awards and are developing the program for that.

Dave Cook discussed his travels with Rotary's Reunite Cultures Fund (formerly Rotary Children's Fund).

- Objectives
  - Organize two-week international trips The organizer randomly contacts Rotary Clubs to see if they want to host American groups and the trips are based on who responds.
  - Find talented youth and arrange for them to tour the United States
  - Cultural exchange Americans can learn about other countries, and they can learn about us.
- Last year he visited Morocco, Lithuania, Georgia, Armenia, and Belarus.
- He emphasized an interest in traveling to Oslo.

 So far student groups from Armenia and Lithuania have stopped in Geneva on travels through the United States. A group of adults from Morocco will be visiting in May.
