Past District Governor and Geneva Rotarian, Dr. Jim Dickson opened the program celebrating long time Rotarian, Dr. Ken Steadman.

Ken was born in May of 1937 (Happy early birthday, Ken!) He was married to Eva (affectionately called "Eva from Geneva") until her recent passing. They travelled around the world together and both were active in Rotary and the community. Ken and Eva received the Springstead Service above Self Award in 2016.

The following Visiting Rotarians spoke on Ken's behalf.

- Ralph Brandt gave an overview of the Rotary Foundation which was created in 1917. The first donation was in the amount of \$26.50 with currently over \$3 billion in grants all over the world. It is the most prestigious foundation in the world.
- Julie Carney thanked Ken (and Eva) for supporting Youth Exchange.
- Ken's grandson, Patrick, shared his experiences as an exchange student in Taipei. He speaks Mandarin and currently works with Sotheby's Auction House.
- Julie and Ralph presented Ken with a Level 3 Donor Pin and Crystal paper weight etched with the Dove of Peace engraving in recognition of Ken's dedication to the Foundation and Rotary. The presentation was followed by a standing ovation honoring Ken. Ken said a few words and thanked everyone for this honor. He also thanked his aide, Rosalie, for her dedicated service.
- All in Rotary are proud of Ken and thank him for his contributions.
- Jack Best also added a few words of congratulations to Ken and Geneva Rotary.
