Induction Ceremony for Paul Harris Fellows

Jim Dickson led the ceremony to induct the newest Paul Harris Fellows – **Katie Flowers** and **Dave Cook**.

For nearly two decades, as Director of the Center for Community Engagement and Service Learning at HWS, **Katie Flowers** has led a multitude of programs that have created a significant partnership between HWS and the greater Finger Lakes community. Under her purview students contribute more than 80,000 hours of community service each year and generate approximately \$110,000 in fundraising efforts that are directed to nonprofit organizations in the region.

In her work, Flowers oversees the Geneva 2030 initiative, service-learning and community-based research programs, the Summer of Service internship program, and facilitates the Faculty Service-Learning Advisory Council and Community Advisory Council. Flowers also directs the America Reads and America Counts Federal workstudy tutoring programs, Alternative Spring Break trips, post-graduate service opportunities, and more.

In the community, Flowers serves on the boards of several local non-profits including Geneva Reads, Wyckoff Family Foundation, and Geneva Educational Foundation. In recognition of her work, she received the inaugural Dorinne Maxwell Memorial Citizenship Prize in 2006, was inducted as an honorary member of the William Smith Class of 2011, received the Young Athena Award from the Geneva Chamber of Commerce in 2013, the Sharing the Light Award from Catholic Charities in 2018, and the Boys and Girls Club Member of the Year in 2019.

She is a co-writer and contributor to Research Handbook on Community Development (2020) and Service-Learning and the Liberal Arts: How and Why It Works (2008)

An AmeriCorps VISTA alumna, Flowers holds a BA in Communications and Business Administration from Stonehill College and Master of Education and Educational Leadership and Policy from the University at Buffalo. She also volunteers as a co-troop leader for the Gift Scouts of the USA and a girls lacrosse coach for YMCA of the USA.

Dave Cook was born and raised in Syracuse and has lived in Geneva for over fifteen years. He worked for the Social Security Administration in several places including Buffalo, Corning, Rochester, and Geneva. Cook is active with Rotary and the Sons of Italy. This is his third Paul Harris Fellowship.
