Program

Today's program was presented by **Frank Sykes**, a Webster, New York native and newly appointed **Executive Director of the Geneva Public Library**. Frank's Dad was a Kiwanian who was active in support of the Special Olympics and volunteering opportunities in several areas of need. Frank came to Geneva from Livonia where he lived for about 20 years. He originally thought he would be a history teacher but an internship at the Rochester Public Library turned his head, thoughts, and passion to library work. Frank arrived in Geneva last fall and is impressed by its diversity and opportunities for volunteering. A presentation by the 2030 initiative sealed the deal for him and he is excited to be creating at least six new programs at GPL. Frank gave a synopsis of last spring's flooding fiasco at the library and the current plan to make sure it never happens again. Reconstruction is slated to begin next Monday. Future plans for programming at the library include a Writers' Event on October 23rd, cooking classes, AARP driver safety course and the already in motion BYO Book Club which meets at Empire Coffee and Donuts on Pre-Emption Road in Geneva.
