## Program:

**Officers Randy Grenier and Mike Tapscott** refreshed us re: **the DARE (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) Program** in Geneva Schools. They are both dedicated veterans of this program, (which is) a ten week “course” for 5<sup>th</sup> grade students in both public and parochial schools. Randy is also present in another capacity as SRO (School Resource Officer), substituting for Raul Arroyo who is out on surgical leave. The DARE program generally is taught in January-February. It is designed to educate kids about the dangers of drugs, alcohol, and violence but also teaches kids how to handle stress, understand consequences, make good decisions, communicate with adults, and trust law enforcement. The program is funded by the Geneva Police Department as a budget item. Both Randy and Mike stressed how much they depend on Geneva Rotary to raise money for this program via **our Golf Tournament.
