Program – Ashley Davoli from Child Advocacy Center:

Ashley is the Executive Director of **the Child Advocacy Center of the Finger Lakes**, an agency that intervenes and facilitates services and support when there are allegations of child abuse or sexual exploitation.

Ashley shared that statistically 1 in 10 children WILL be sexually abused by age 10, and 60% of those never tell. 90% of child sexual abuse victims are abused by someone they know. Ashley also discussed the initiatives that are being taken in schools in NYS to provide body safety education from Kindergarten up – children may not know that the behavior of an adult is wrong if nobody is explaining body safety.

Ashley's agency facilitates and coordinates all of the support and services that a child and their family will need when there are allegations of abuse, including interviewing the child, arranging for counseling, coordinating with law enforcement, etc. The goal of CAC is to minimize any additional trauma to a child that has already been traumatized, and advocate for the child throughout the entire process after a report has been made. The CAC also does a lot of

education with law enforcement and first responders to help them understand the best approach when responding to these situations.
