PROGRAM

Today we welcomed Geneva native **Bo Wright, Superintendent of Schools**. John Gonzales, Assistant Superintendent of teaching, learning, and accountability, Steve Kruger, Assistant Superintendent for administrative services, and Jesse Lambert, Assistant Superintendent of business and finance. They presented an outline of the district's mission which is, in essence, to produce graduates who will lead lives of consequence. They outlined some of the effective additions (patriot officers) and changes they have made to the learning environment to ensure that it is safe, inclusive, equitable, and positive.

- Improving security in the school buildings is a priority, including additional cameras, a digitized PA system, and digital signage.
- They emphasized using the "Corrective Approach" to open lines of communication, adding more training for all administration and staff in "restorative practices" used to build relationships with students.
- The district is building bridges with area colleges to bring in teachers and anticipates filling 30 positions in the near future. They are pleased that two contracts, CSEA and ADMIN, have already been settled.
- Bo announced to us today that the district has been awarded an Early College
 High School Grant which will partner the district with area colleges and
 industries, garnering college credit in high school and on the job skills. The longterm goal will be to earn an associates degree in high school.
- The district's goal is to increase the graduation rate to 85% this year.
