Program

Kath Fuchs presented "What the Heck are They Teaching in English These Days?" She gave an overview of the English class she teaches at FLCC. She focuses on critical thinking and teaching her students how to write. Since writing is a process, she lets her students re-write their assignments as many times as possible. The class is inperson with online components. Sample lessons -

- For the first week of class she shares <a href="Why I'm Done with Trying to be "Man Enough" and Power of Vulnerability. The class forms a circle and shares their most meaningful experience in their life. The students then write down their experiences and edit the narratives together.
- Students post pictures online and they have to write to each other about the pictures.
- There is a lesson on civil discourse based on <u>"The Night Thoreau Spent In Jail"</u>
- The students read, annotate and analysis <u>FDR's Four Freedoms Speech</u>. They also view <u>Norman Rockwell's Four Freedoms</u>. Based on the speech and paintings they write and create a collage about which freedom is the most important to them. An art therapist helps analysis the collages.
- Kath reads the letter she wrote to her dad in 1999 about what she loves about him. For extra credit the students can write to someone and tell them why they are important.

She also likes to share something inspirational each week with the class. Examples include Thoughts To Ponder, Desiderata, Mama Is A Sunrise, Those Winter Sundays, If -, and Night Watch (which were all distributed).
