Share a memory or story of Memorial Day.

- Jim DeVaney His father-in-law's uncle was Aeneas McDonald who is the only GPD officer to be killed in the line of duty. On February 19, 1924, he was shot while stopping an attempted robbery at the New Central Railroad Station and he later died from his wounds. A commemorative badge has been designed and will be worn throughout this year. There is a monument for McDonald in front of the Public Safety Building. A memorial service is held there each year and members of the DeVaney family attend.
- Dave Cook His brother served in the Marines for 20 years and did three tours in Vietnam.
- Dick Austin In high school he wanted to join the Navy and serve on a nuclear submarine, but he is too tall. He also talked about his visit to <u>Grant's Cottage</u> located outside of Saratoga Springs. Ulysses S. Grant spent the last six weeks of his life at the cottage finishing his memoirs. Paul Bleakley said <u>Grant's memoirs</u> remains the best military memoir in US history.

Bill Flood – Served in the Navy on the *Tirante*. It was a re-purposed World War II submarine. During World War II it sank at least two Japanese ships and received a Presidential Unit Citation. In the 1960s Bill was deployed to the Mediterranean. During boot camp he didn't know what he wanted to do. While on his way to speak to a career counselor a fellow soldier said he was going to serve on a sub and Bill thought that was a good idea.
