Kerry Lippincott and Dick Austin took the pledge as President-Elect and Vice President respectively and were presented with their pins.

Program

Kerry Lippincott shared the story of Emancipation Celebrations in Geneva. The event started after 1834 when enslaved people were freed in the British West Indies. Like the Declaration of Independence, Emancipation Celebrations were a form of political protest, as blacks in the North gathered, usually in August, to protest their exclusion from the rights other Americans celebrated on Independence Day.

Between 1840 and the early 1900s Western New York Emancipation Celebrations moved from town to town and were hosted by Canandaigua, Auburn, Penn Yan, Geneva and other area communities. Its central location and sizeable black population made Geneva a favorite spot for these events, and the village hosted at least eleven times. The one day event included speeches, prayers, parades, sports competitions, music and a dance.
