Program

Phil Beckey introduced **Dr. Jose Acevedo, President & C.E.O. UR Medicine Finger Lakes Health** and **Steve Goldstein, President of Integration Strategy, UR Medical Center**. The pair discussed Finger Health –

- Geneva Hospital was established in 1898 and Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Hospital in 1924
- Finger Lakes Health serves four counties
- Why did Finger Lakes Health join UR Medical Center?
 - They vetted nine organizations and selected the best partner
 - No other organization has the reputation that U of R Medical Center has
 - Their business model – Doctors are sent to community hospitals to keep the patients in their own community
 - The ability to offer new services like neurosurgery
 - Access to more resources
- Goal of UR Medical Center is to create a premiere health care network in upstate New York
- Other affiliates include Hornell, Dansville, and Canandaigua
- Through their affiliates, UR Medical Center is committed to
 - Keeping services at local hospitals
 - Growing service lines to increase volume
 - Continuing to add new services locally
- Consequences of not using Finger Lakes Health
 - Reduction in services
 - Traveling outside of the region for services
 - Longer waits
 - Higher co-pays and costs
 - Potential facility closures
 - Loss of jobs
- Questions
 - Are spaces within the hospital re-opening? - Yes, the cancer center on Washington Street and Flaum Eye Institute are moving into the hospital

- Healthcare in the future – Hard to say how it will be paid for. Due to the cost of a medical education (\$600,000), there will be more foreign-born doctors, physician assistants and nurse practitioners
- Impact of AI – AI will act as a scribe and provide diagnostic information so doctors can focus on the patient
