The new (2024) center in Canandaigua includes a virtual reality lab, a health care suite for training, and a hospitality suite, also for training. The lab is partnered with RIT. Training will be quite specific in hospitality, front desk, culinary arts, health care, warehouse and manufacturing certifications, and more.
