She gave an informative presentation on a new program she has initiated – **Center for Advanced Professional Studies – (CAPS)**

The Mission is to empower high school students with hands-on experience that help them explore their interests, strengths, and passions. The program enables participants to:

- Uncover what they love – engage in real-world projects that reveal their interests and preferences
- Build valuable skills: gain practical experience that highlights their talents and abilities
- Make informed choices: prepare for life after high school with clarity and confidence.

This started as one program but has grown to 120 programs world-wide. It is the first CAPS program in NY State.
