Program:

Geneva native, Rotary scholarship veteran, HWS grad, businessman and **Geneva mayoral candidate Jim Cecere** spoke today. Post graduation, Jim worked in NYC in finance, specifically related to reducing costs in health care. After several years, he found little or no purpose in an industry which sought to drive shareholder value but had little result in helping people get better care. He tried living in Florida for a while next but found that he still wasn't where he should be. He bought his dad's house in Geneva on Hamilton Street and eventually opened his business, FLX Goods which sells items made specifically (and only) here in the Finger Lakes. He added Vinifera to this business (both on Linden Street) to express his belief of the FLX wine industry. His business is focused on building local relationships and celebrating local products. He recently opened a new "store" in Ithaca.

Jim is a candidate for Mayor of Geneva. Even though he does not consider himself to be a politician, he is definitely a good citizen who wants to help his community. His most pressing issue is housing, finding that only 49 percent of houses in Geneva are owner occupied. Investors are buying houses with inflated prices, using cash, and driving locals out of the market. His priority will be Incentivizing for the Home Owners.

Secondly, he is focused on Economic Development in Downtown Geneva where no fewer than SIX agencies now have some level of jurisdiction. He sees that they can be aligned and combined.

Jim is also focused on the Ice Rink on Exchange Street, which is old and outdated. He envisions creating a Sports-Rec Corridor activity-based community center that is a year-round facility.

Jim has been meeting with City Council, the Fire, Police, and DPW, etc departments as well. If you are interested in helping, see above for his October 9th Rally.
