Questions:

- Re: cashless bail most cases he's prosecuted don't fall under cashless bail directives (homicide, abuse, etc.), not in favor of hard, fast rules, judges should have the tools to assess each situation; getting support from downstate prosecutors now to change the law – some of those policies need to be undone
- Re: current Ontario Cty DA's office caseload, including Norquist case and Legion embezzlement – plans to hit the ground running, has spoken to many involved has open communication and has sat in on court hearings.
