Program:

In the first of a series of **Traveling Rotarians** presentations, **Diana Perry** shared pictures and information from her May 2025 trip to England and Scotland. She and Dave Cook toured with a small group organized by Reunite Cultures Fund, a non-profit tour company started by a Rotarian to raise money for youth cultural exchange program. Tours offer opportunities to meet and spend time with Rotarians around the world, in addition to traditional tour activities.

First stop: London, where they met with London's District Governor. They did walking tours of several neighborhoods, visiting the London Eye, Tower of London, a street art neighborhood, with a side trip for Diana to the British Museum.

Outside London: Stonehenge, Bath, Windsor Castle and a classic Elizabethan-era village owned and maintained by Britain's National Trust.

Then, via train from Kings Cross Station (made famous in Harry Potter), to Edinburgh and the Scottish Highlands, whiskey tasting at the home of Johnny Walker, searching for Nessie at the Loch (a similar size to our Seneca but much deeper), and other sites.

In Glasgow, they were greeted with a street party with rowdy crowds dressed in green celebrating the Glasgow Celtics team's win.
