He mentioned that there are 41 Districts and each has its own mayor. The pictures were beautiful and showed the amazing abilities of the ancient builders. He highlighted Cuzco which is the historic capital of the Inca Empire and a major cultural and tourist hub located high in the Andes Mountains, 11,152 feet high above sea level making it one of the world’s highest cities.
