Program: Today's program was presented by **Ontario County Office of the Aging and Rob Griffin of the Ontario Co. Sheriff's Office.** They shared some valuable information about Fraud, Scams and Identity Theft.

- Over 5 Billion dollars were scammed from people in 2022, and that is just those that were reported.
- Fraudsters target elderly. These criminals get information from social media, data breaches, curated phone lists and victims themselves that are unaware that they're being scammed.
- They advised that because of AI, we should never say the word "yes" on the phone because they can record your voice and use it to scam you. Don't click on anything that seems suspicious.
- Also, beware of QR codes. Only use if you know who created it.
- Common scams are fake Medicare calls, dating sites, virtual games, grandparent scams, investment scams, online shopping, cloud, home repair, lawn care and debt collections.

- The new scam is on What's App so beware if you use it. If a spinner pops up, it is a scam. They are also sending packages and telling you to scan the QR code to see who sent it to you.
- Another common one is ATM skimmers. Just wiggle it. It shouldn't be loose.
- What can you do if you think you are being scammed? Don't engage, hang up, report it to the local police. You can get RFID blocking sleeve to protect your credit cards in your wallet and purse. Also, use strong passwords and change them often.
- They suggest having a family code word in case someone calls you pretending to be a family member in need.
- You can also sign up for SilverShield through the Office of the Aging by calling 585-396-4047. You can send them a screenshot of a message and they will tell you if it is a scam. You can also hang up and call the company they are pretending to represent.
